

Welcome to the spring edition of Bradwell Parish News.

With spring thoughts very much in mind, a fulfilling aspect of being a parish councillor has been helping to enhance the local



environment by planting trees and shrubs. Last year the parish council planted three dozen fruiting trees as part of the regeneration of King George's Field in Bradwell village. Planting a long row of trees on South Field, Heelands, was a bigger job, with over 70 trees. This included six larger trees, gifted by MKC, that were previously in planters at Milton Keynes Central railway station: so it was good to find a new home for these.

I'm pleased to say, too, that following a successful grant application to the Woodlands Trust, we have enhanced the planting at Heelands South Field with a further 420 small shrubs and saplings, to create the beginnings of a new hedgerow.

More recently still, the parish council has agreed to plant five new fruit trees in the Quiet Garden next to Bradwell Sports and Social Club.

Let's hope all our plans bear fruit!

Clerk's Column

The winter is finally over, after quite a few frosty mornings. On landscaping in early spring we will be reseeding Abbey Field wildflower meadow, which every couple of years needs it otherwise it turns to thistle and weeds and the flowers either stop producing or get die off.



We have put in two benches, one inside the King George's Field play area and a picnic bench just outside it. Another will shortly be installed, in memory of Robin Bradburn.

The Parish Council has been engaging with residents, firstly to see if the Bradwell Common residents want the Parish Council to petition for 20mph speed limits to be introduced by MKCC, the other is really a request for residents to fill in the questionnaire to apply to MKCC to register the land between Mayditch Place and Coleshill Place, at the back of Summerfield School, as a Village Green, rather than a space which at some point in the future may be converted to residential property.

The Heritage Trail also is a project, which is beginning to pick up traction, though it is a rather long-term project, which may take a while before it happens. One initial stage is to build a plinth upon which an information board can mounted, reminding residents of the ancient Roman history of Heelands!

Did you know that Bradwell Parish Council is able to award grants to local groups to benefit parish residents?

We do not give grants to individuals. The application forms are available on our website. Below is a small snippet of what we have been able to support in recent months.

Bradwell Village Pond Update

We have recently received a report from the Newt Conservation Partnership to let us know that they found great crested newt eDNA during their habitat survey and environmental eDNA sampling. This is a standard method of assessing great crested newt presence. It involves taking a water sample which is analysed to see if it contains great crested newt DNA.

Milton Keynes Museum

Milton Keynes Museum is celebrating a milestone in its own history with the recent launch of its brand new, state-of-the-art gallery showing the rich

tapestry of history in the area.

The Ancient Gallery brings the new city's past to life like never before, using the latest technology to stir imaginations, starting with the fossilised remains of an 180 million year old Ichthyosaur.

The gallery also houses remnants of much more recent dwellers -



including the woolly mammoths and woolly rhinos who once walked the space that has now become the fastest growing city in the country.

Visitors will explore life in the area during the palaeolithic and mesolithic times, and gain a greater understanding of just what those Roman visitors did for us - and how their legacy remains today. The gallery is very accessible to all ages.

"To now be able to tell the history of Milton Keynes in such a vivid way is so exciting," said Museum director Bill Griffiths.

"We couldn't be prouder of what we've achieved so far - and we have even more to come with the launch of our New Gallery later this year, which will shine a light on a very modern city," Bill added.

HomeWorld 81 Exhibition

In 1979 the Board of Milton Keynes Development Corporation approved the idea of creating an exhibition of showhouses built by developers from around the world that would publicise the growing city in Bradwell Common. Nineteen developers signed up and a total of 26 houses were available for the public to view when the doors were opened on 2 May. There were a wide range of properties to view, from one person studios to luxury bungalows (one of which even had a water bed!); kit houses from Scandinavia, New Zealand and the UK, from national developers to small local builders.

The exhibition was a huge success and, when the gates finally closed on 31 May, HomeWorld 81 had been visited by 150,000 people. Most importantly it gave MKDC the confidence, to plan a follow-up exhibition, Energy World in Shenley Lodge in 1986.

St Lawrence Church
