Clerk's Column

By the time you read this winter will be well underway. In September the Parish Council lost one Parish Councillor, Robin Bradburn, and our sympathies rest with his family. Barring a new bench, the King George's Field play area is complete and there always seem to be children playing there whenever I go past it. Photos of the play area are visible elsewhere in this edition, alongside the original design by Kompan, the chosen playground



installer. The grant money of £60,000 has been received from the FCC Communities Foundation, and another grant of £25,528 received from Milton Keynes City Council, which was largely on account of the development in Bradwell Common at Hampstead Gate (the money has been distributed primarily because of the zip-wire, which is used by the older children and teenagers). Without these grants the project would not have happened. With receipt of the grant moneys the project has cost the Parish Council very little and the play area is a vast improvement in local facilities. Next project is solar panels on the roof of the Bradwell Memorial Hall, pending various consents and logistics. Grant match funding has been approved by Milton Keynes Council and so the business of the Parish Council moves on!



Bradwell Abbey Scout Group

Bradwell Abbey Scout Group have opened a new section for boys and girls aged 10 to 14. They meet at the Cruck Barn, Discovery Centre, Alston Drive, MK13 9AP, 7.00pm to 8.30pm. The opening of the Scout Troop is due to the demand for places from young people. With several children moving from Cubs to Scouts and children on the waiting list, the Group made the decision to open a new section so more young people can join.

Children and young people in Scouts can get involved in over 250 activities. These range from abseiling to firelighting, geocaching to navigation and pioneering to zorbing. Skills they can learn and develop include teamwork, self-confidence, problem solving and social skills.
