Especially when new and planned flats in CMK include too few spaces and several multi-storey garages sit unused and closed to the public. Surely CMK wants as many shoppers as possible?

The King George's Field Play Area redevelopment project has finally finished, in that although the playground proper was completed last summer, the benches were installed over the winter and the tarmac path around the play area was completed in May of this year. the sunny weather has been enjoyed by many it has unfortunately caused the demise of some of the saplings on the edge of Heelands South Field which were planted over the winter, as there was so little rain this Spring. The saplings were received free of charge from The Woodlands Trust, through a grant. Hopefully the arrival of rain will help stem any further losses. Business of the Parish Council is always under review this time of year, with our accounts being audited both internally and externally, to make sure the Parish has water-tight systems of internal control in place, and aims to achieve best value for money on all projects undertaken. In other news wrangling with MKCC continues over funding for playgrounds, and hopefully this will bear fruit, in time. With the caveat that these things take time.

Grant Update

Did you know that Bradwell Parish Council is able to award grants to local groups to benefit parish residents?

We do not give grants to individuals. The application forms are available on our website. Below is a small snippet of what we have been able to support in recent months.

YMCA: £1000 towards their Activity Programme, activities could include fitness, sports, painting and crafts.

Friends of Conniburrow Children's Centre: £200 towards their trip to Thrift Farm in the summer.

Priory Common School

The school has some exciting news to share regarding their upcoming ASC Unit (Autism Spectrum Conditions Unit).



They are very excited to announce that the building work for the unit, which is set to open in September, started at the beginning of May. This development marks a significant step forward in enhancing the educational opportunities they can provide at the school for the children in our community.

St Lawrence Church

The gardening club runs from March to the end of November and is made up of volunteers. The club receives no funds to maintain the churchyard. They maintain the north edge bed; around the headstones; the hedges; litter pick and check the gullies around the church. The churchyard contains apple, pear and plum trees. The fruit is used for making preserves. Electric power tools are used which are better for the environment. Over the last few years, the hedges have been lowered to improve visibility and security with better vistas of the church. Paul helps with tree identification and checks on the bat boxes. Lawn cutting is carried out by JV Hough. They are a small friendly group, who would welcome more volunteers to lighten the load. The members often see groups of walkers and runners coming through the churchyard who are always complimentary about the state of the churchyard.

In May 2024 Bradwell Parish Council donated the sum of £472 to provide a volunteer befriender for their clients living within the parish area.

The volunteer befriender assists clients who are struggling with mental health issues, loneliness, poor physical health and who have felt unable to cope. He visits clients at home, assists clients to engage with health care services, catching buses, shopping trips, going for coffee and going on outings. He provides a listening ear, practical assistance and support with day to day living.

One example of practical assistance provided for a local client included putting up shelves and fitting a carpet. The client had recently moved to a new home in the area after experiencing a traumatic event which had resulted in loss of life and the loss of their home. Having found herself homeless she had been living in hotels. Connection Support has been able to support her through this difficult period and the befriender has been able to go that extra mile to assist her and has helped her to turn her new accommodation into a home. The befriender is delighted that when he visits, she makes him cake!

Gingerbread Men

Ingredients

350g plain flour 125g butter

1 egg

1 tsp bicarbonate of soda

2 tsp ground ginger

1 tsp ground cinnamon

175g light soft brown sugar

4 tbsp golden syrup

Water icing (optional)

cake decorations or raisins

Method

Sift together the flour, bicarbonate of soda, ginger and cinnamon and rub in the butter until it resembles breadcrumbs. Stir in the sugar.

Lightly beat the egg and golden syrup together and add to the mixture. Knead until smooth, wrap in cling film and leave to chill in the fridge for 15 minutes.

Preheat the oven to 180C/160C Fan/ Gas 4. Line two baking trays with baking paper.

Roll the dough out to a 0.5cm thickness. Using cutters, cut out the gingerbread men shapes.

Bake for 12-15 mins.

Once cooled decorate with icing and decorations (see photo below).
