On 26 October the Parish Council was successful in obtaining approval for a public works loan in order to pay for the Community Centre construction cost. Planning permission is being sought and the release of remaining funds from the developer (held by Milton Keynes City Council) has been requested.

The new meadow looked lovely earlier in the summer. Our contractors have been maintaining the meadow by removing the sow thistle. They came back in late September/early October to cut it when the flowers had gone to seed to cut it. The seed was knocked out by the collector and returned back onto the ground to grow again next year.

Dog Hygiene Bin Service

Did you know that the dog waste bins in Bradwell Parish are provided by the Parish Council? We provide over 40 bins. They are all numbered so if you notice one is broken or overflowing please do let us know.

New research by Keep Britain Tidy reveals that the amount of dog mess being left by owners in our parks has increased since the start of 2021.

A survey carried out by YouGov shows that most dog owners dispose of dog waste responsibly, either putting it in a bin in the park (85%) or taking it home with them (40%), however, 4% admit leaving it unbagged on the ground, hanging from a tree, on a post, or under a bush which equates to around 35.3 tonnes of dog waste.

Hello all residents – things have been busy at Bradwell Parish Council since I last wrote in the Summer edition. In terms of local facilities, and at the request of residents, we are shortly to install a new bench on the wildflower

meadow in Bradwell, and two new litter bins, with tops, by the sports pitches.

A meeting was held in July, where nearly thirty members of the public attended, in order to have their say and raise their opinions or doubts over the proposed stadium, lighting and parking measures at the pitches in Bradwell. And again the result was that the Parish Council decided not to give permission for BSSC to proceed with the new measures and all will remain as it is.

On the Bradwell grounds, the wildflowers all blossomed and bloomed, and now are browning as the autumn nights get cooler, but still provide a habitat for insects, which encourage birds and small animals. The pond however is still void of standing water, and we will be looking at options on this and keeping you updated.

Judging by the very full dog-litter bins, and as it has been a busy summer for our dog bin emptying contactor, many more people have dogs that two summers' ago, and it is good to see people walking around the Parish and enjoying all the green spaces the Parish Council manages.

Christmas Cookies

INGREDIENTS

200g unsalted butter, softened 280g caster sugar ¼ tsp vanilla extract 1 egg 400g plain flour A pinch of salt ½ tsp cream of tartar lcing sugar Food colouring Sprinkles



INSTRUCTIONS

Preheat the oven to 170C/325F and line trays with baking paper. Cream the butter, sugar and vanilla extract together until the mixture is light and fluffy, then add the egg.

Add the dry ingredients to the creamed mixture. Mix together until it's a ball of soft dough.

Roll out the dough until it is about ½cm thick.

Use festive cutters to cut shapes out and place them on the baking trays.

Bake the cookies for around 10 minutes.

Leave to cool for a few minutes and then place on a wire rack to cool completely.

Decorate the cookies as illustrated, using the icing sugar, food colouring and sprinkles.


Bradwell Bowls Club—Mower


