The parish council reached an important milestone with our project to build a new community hall on the old Suffolk Punch site in Heelands as it was given planning permission in April. We are also in the process of preparing a bid for funding from the Community Infrastructure Fund which would allow us to improve Bradwell Common Local Centre next year.

Bradwell Common Local Centre—Planters

As many of you will have seen, the planters at Bradwell Common Local Centre are reaching the end of their life and the wood is starting to rot away.

We are currently working with Milton Keynes Council - who own the land

and the planters - to develop proposals to improve the area via a bid for funding from the Community Infrastructure Fund.

One option is simply to replace the existing wooden sleepers on a like-for-like basis. However, we are taking the opportunity to also consider the possibility of making more substantial changes to the area such as removal of the raised flowerbeds and replacing them with a landscaped area at ground level.

Abbey Field Pond

You may have been wondering what was happening at the pond recently. Well, the pond has been designated as a site for Great Crested Newts to breed in.

Bradwell Parish Council are working in partnership with the Newt Conservation Partnership, which is part of the Freshwater Habitats Trust.

In the autumn the left part of the pond will be filled in. This is because there is an invasive weed growing in that part of the pond and the best way to eradicate it is cover it over with soil. We will ensure that all wildlife has left the pond before we do that—there are no fish in the pond. The next task will be to dig out the right side of the pond.


Abbey field pond is an ideal site to attract and nurture Great Crested Newts because of the surrounding environment - the field and allotments for example.

We would like to ask dog owners not to let their dogs play in the pond as it can disturb the newts and also any flea insecticide on the dogs can be a problem to the newts.

This project will be totally funded by the Newt Conservation Partnership.

A year of activity for the Great Crested Newt

Legal protection applies to each of these life stages. A Great Crested Newt can live for up to 15 years!

Parish Grant Updates

Food Bank

The Food Bank were granted a grant in September 2020 which enabled them to purchase an electric pallet truck and some additional food items that were in short supply.

At the outset of the pandemic, demand for the Food Bank's service increased dramatically. Being an organisation that had historically operated using donations only, they quickly found themselves in a position where they had very low supplies of certain food types for their emergency food parcels, for example squash, long-life fruit juices and custard. The grant enabled them to buy the foods they had in short supply in bulk,



which enabled them to build a body of stock, so they do not run out of emergency food supplies.

The purchase of the pallet truck has enabled the Food Bank to move pallets with ease and will continue to improve the overall operation once they move into their new warehouse at Kiln Farm.

Bradwell Common Hall

The hall was awarded a grant in February 2020 to replace their chairs. Sadly, due to the pandemic, they haven't been able to use the new chairs, but hopefully that will change in the very near future. The hall manager reports that the preschool staff make good use of the armchairs when taking a much needed break!



YMCA

In April 2021 Bradwell Parish Council awarded a grant towards the YMCA's Supported Living programme.

In March 2020 the YMCA moved into their new, state of the art building. This building has increased their capacity and significantly improved the level of support they are able to offer to residents. YMCA MK is now home to 226 young people, with

an average age of 24. In response to increased need they have refurbished seven rooms into further accommodation for young people.

Although the pandemic has prevented the building being used as they had hoped, they are optimistic that with restrictions easing the building will regain some of the community, campus feel they were aiming for.

They currently have thirty rooms available for those seeking emergency accommodation and they are full. The young people who stay at YMCA are amongst the most vulnerable and disadvantaged young adults in MK.



Residents arriving seeking emergency accommodation often have nowhere else to turn.

Many of the residents have complex support needs; ranging from experience of street homelessness, mental health issues, substance abuse, difficulties with mainstream schooling, and experience of trauma.

Many have experienced a breakdown in family relationships.

At one point they had 29 young people needing emergency accommodation. They are currently supporting at least ten residents who identify strongly with Bradwell parish.

Bellfounder House

The sheltered housing complex was awarded a grant in September 2020 to enable them to buy some much needed kitchen equipment for when COVID restrictions are lifted. The following items were purchased, plate warmer, large cooking pot and other pans, food mixer and processor, crockery and knife set and baking trays.

Old Bradwell Tennis Club

The tennis club received a grant in June 2020. So far, they have bought some junior racquets and junior balls. They plan to use the rest of the grant to advertise the club in the local area so watch out for the leaflet that will be dropping through your doors!

Look out for free tennis coaching being offered to parish residents, with their tennis coach, Jason Fairhurst, during the autumn half term. They'd love you to join the club.

Tennis coach, Jason Ferguson, is an ex Scottish champion and is proving very popular. He is a fully qualified LTA (Lawn Tennis Association) coach and coaches adults as well as children and groups of friends.

But you don't have to wait until the free coaching session to join the club. If you are interested, why not contact them now.

Whilst they have been unable to arrange any coaching sessions due to Covid, they have been concentrating on inviting more people from the parish to join, and have had some success using Facebook with families from Heelands and Bradwell joining.

The club are keen to attract new members and they are one of the lowest cost tennis clubs in Milton Keynes.

The annual fees are:

New members £5 joining fee (only applicable for the first year of

membership)

Single (over 18): £44

Family: £82 Over: 60's £30 Junior (over 14): £25

Junior: £20

The annual fee includes all the tennis you want to play until 31 May

2022. There is also an active WhatsApp group, where members can contact other members to arrange a social game. The club has an online booking system where any member can book a court up to two weeks ahead.

scope covers, recoverable kitchens and flood barriers and doors – including those suitable for listed buildings. The Floodmobile also showcases various types of waterproof plaster and insulation.

Charity Recycling MK

Did you know that there is someone in Milton Keynes that recycles the stuff that you can't put in your recycling sacks, for charity?

Charity Recycling MK's aim is to reduce the volume of domestic plastics sent to landfill and use it instead, thanks to sponsorship, to raise money for charity.

George Thomson is a TerraCycle UK approved dropoff point administrator. This is totally voluntary and he receives no payment for this work. All funds raised are shared between Willen Hospice and MK Cat Rescue.

The charity's original focus was on Tassimo discs and wrappers and they remain the mainstay of the operation, but now also Nespresso L'Or pods, Kenco wrappers, biscuit wrappers of all kinds, trigger spray guns, surface wipe packaging, plastic tops and air freshener products. More recently crisp and nut bags, cheese wrappers, dental and beauty products, and confectionery have all been added.

The drop-off bin is at 25 Cantle Avenue, Downs Barn, MK14 7RJ where it is available 24/7. Free carrier bags are also provided as are information leaflets.

Recycling and charity cash distribution is managed by TerraCycle UK and the scheme is sponsored by the various product manufacturers.

Orange No Bake Cheesecake

Ingredients

15 Digestive biscuits 6 tbsp Butter, melted 400g Curd or Cream cheese Grated zest 3 oranges (save the segments for the decoration) 200g Mascarpone cheese 100g Caster sugar 3 tbsp Milk



Method

- 1. Crush the biscuits roughly by putting them in a plastic food bag and crushing them with a wooden spoon.
- 2. Put the biscuits into a bowl and mix in the melted butter. Put the mixture into a 23cm cheesecake tin, then use the back of a spoon to spread it evenly and press it down in the tin to form the base. Put the tin into the fridge to set. This should take about 30 mins.
- 3. Put the curd or cream cheese, orange zest, mascarpone, sugar and milk into a bowl and mix it well with the wooden spoon.
- 4. Put the cream in a clean bowl and whisk until it is the consistency of thick custard. Add to the orange mixture and mix thoroughly.
- 5. Remove the cheesecake tin from the fridge. Pour the filling over the biscuit base and spread evenly. Decorate with segments of orange and return to the fridge until ready to serve (at least 4 hours or overnight).
